

Attachment for Stand Up Forklift

Stand Up Forklift Attachments - IC engine powered trucks are labeled according to the fuel used. Type "G" forklifts are gasoline fueled. They meet the minimum standards for fire hazards. This is the most common designation found on gasoline fueled lift trucks. Forklifts labeled "G" are not utilized in dangerous places for apparent reasons. Type "GS" trucks are gasoline fueled and meet all the requirements of a Type "G" truck and include various machines installed to the electrical and fuel and exhaust system to be able to allow them to be used in certain hazardous places. Type "GS" trucks are used in similar applications to Type "EE" electric trucks.

The "LP" class of forklifts are LPG powered and do not satisfy minimum standards for fire hazards and should not be used in dangerous sites. This is however the most frequent designation for LPG fueled lift trucks. Type "LPS" forklifts are fueled by LPG and meet all of the standards of a Type "G" truck. They have different pieces of equipment installed to the fuel system, exhaust system and electrical system so as to allow them to be utilized in certain hazardous applications. Type "LPS" trucks are utilized in similar applications to Type "GS" and Type "EE" electric trucks.

As dual fuel models, the "G/LP" lift trucks could be operated on either LPG or gasoline. These trucks are not to be used in unsafe sites, yet meet minimum requirements for fire hazards. Type "GS/LPS" forklifts are dual fuel models since they could be operated on gasoline or LPG without any change to the fuel system. These trucks meet all of the requirements of a Type "GS" or Type "LPS" truck and include different machinery installed to their fuel system, exhaust system and electrical system, to be able to allow them to be used in certain unsafe applications. Type "GS/LPS" forklifts are used in similar applications to Type "GS", Type "LPS" and Type "EE" electric lift trucks.

Type "D" trucks represent diesel fueled and meet the minimum standards for fire hazards. These lift trucks labeled "D" are not utilized in hazardous places. Type "DS" lift trucks are diesel fueled and meet all of the requirements of a Type "D" truck and have different equipment installed to the electrical system, fuel system, and exhaust system in order to allow them to be used in some hazardous locations. Type "DS" forklifts are used in comparable applications to Type "GS", Type "LPS" and Type "EE" electric trucks. Type "DY" lift trucks are fueled by diesel and satisfy all the requirements of Type "DS" trucks and also do not include whatever electrical machines installed. These forklifts use air starters and come with some provisions so as to limit the temperature of the forklift parts. These trucks could be used in similar conditions and situations as the type "EE" electric lift truck.
